New Board-member: Natalija Mazeikiene

During the IARTEM-conference at Tonsberg, Norway, a new board was installed. In Newsletter # 7 (Autumnn 2007) we introduced two of the three new board members. Here's the introduction of our third new board member: prof. Natalija Mazeikiene.

Natalija Mazeikiene is Vice-Rector for Development at Vytautas Magnus University (Lithuania, Kaunas) and Associate Professor of Education at the Department of Philosophy at Siauliai University (Lithuania, Siauliai). She got her B.A. and M.A. in Philosophy from Sankt-Petersburg State University (Russia) and Ph.D. in Education from Siauliai University (Lithuania). Her Ph.D. dissertation dealt with cross-cultural adaptation and transferability of tools for assessment and measurement of learning outcomes in citizenship and moral education. Natalija Mazeikiene's main research interests reflected in her publications are citizenship and intercultural education, gender studies, critical pedagogy, hidden curriculum. Since the beginning of her professional work career Natalija Mazeikiene has worked in Siauliai University as university teacher at Philosophy Department, research fellow in Gender Studies Centre and Educational Research Centre, as Vice-Rector for International Relations and Development, by implementing research and institutional development projects on educational innovations.

International Seminar on History and Social Sciences Textbook

November 11-12, 2008, Santiago, Chile

The successful "Seminario Internacional de Textos Escolares -SITE 2006" demonstrated that high-quality textbooks were one of the most important factors in making the learning experience more relevant to students and teachers.

The Ministry of Education through its Textbook Unit, has decided to continue with an international forum to maintain the dialogue on textbooks and to develop academic competences related to teachers" knowledge in this area.

The International Seminar on History and Social Sciences textbook will take place in Santiago, Chile, on the 11th & 12th November 2008.

The goal of the Seminar is to share the broad array of ideas, perspectives and to open spaces for discussion relating to teaching practices within History and Social Sciences textbooks from a national and international approach.

Specific goals:

- To analyze textbooks and teaching material considering the instructional design and content treatment in the light of their contribution to understand new social phenomena.
- To motivate History and Social Studies professionals to develop competences in the improvement of both the quality and the access to textbooks.
- To provide a forum to explore responses across the broad range of disciplinary perspectives found within History and Social Studies, especially in the area of citizenship.
- To exchange experiences considering relevant issues such as: the recognition and respect for individual and collective identity, the need for social and cultural cohesion, the multiple perspectives on history and contemporary issues within their historical context.
- To establish and maintain a centre of essential information on the expert organization and publications interested in the field of textbook improvement.
- To discuss new studies related to textbook improvement developed in different countries by professional groups.

Teachers, graduate students, publishers, university-based faculty of education researchers related to History, Geography or Social Sciences are invited to be part of this Seminar.

The Seminar welcomes contributions on the following topics:

- 1. History and Social Sciences didactics in textbooks.
- 2. New disciplinary approaches History, Geography and other Social Sciences, and its treatment in textbooks.
- 3. Content analyses in History and Social Sciences textbooks.
- 4. How the subject of citizenship is shown in textbooks.

Conference at Maastricht, Netherlands, about Student Mobility and ICT

At 19-20 November 2008 an Conference will be held about Student Mobility and ICT: Can E-LEARNING overcome barriers of Life-Long learning?

An increasing number of students enroll in educational programs in Europe outside their native country. A reasonable response in order to facilitate their transition is to offer remedial education in distance learning format. Information Communication Technology (ICT) offers some powerful tools which might benefit life-long learning. Recently, ICT has gained the power to support independent learning as well as learning irrespective of time and geographical dispersion with the wide-spread implementation of Internet. In addition, ICT provides powerful tools for learning in collaborative settings where students work and learn together.

This conference should be regarded as an opportunity to present how ICT and E-learning can help European learners on their life-long learning paths, and to discuss your recent research findings with other scholars. Topics are:

- 1. Knowledge acquisition in e-learning and the role of social knowledge building in (distance) education
- 2. Collaborative knowledge construction in education context and Computer Supported Collaborative Learning (CSCL)
- 3. Barriers to Life-long learning and how to solve them
- 4. Good-practices of remedial education and special education and the combination with e-learning

What makes an effective textbook? 2nd edition of succesful course

- quality of content
- pedagogical approach
- design and presentation
- production standards
